A HUGE Shout-out to Carmel High School!

The Carmel High School club, This Club Saves Lives, sponsored a toiletry drive for Family House in San Francisco. Family House serves as a home away from home for families of children with cancer and other life-threatening illnesses by providing a place to live and support while going through treatment at UCSF's Benioff Children's Hospital. The club had a competition between the freshmen class and collected over 3,000 toiletries for Family House. Many of the toiletries were donated by local

hotels, stores, and families. The toiletries are available for families to use while at Family House. Carmel High School senior Caroline Mierzwa was the organizer of the drive and is pictured with part of our collection. Caroline volunteered as a live-in intern over the summer and is going back for two weeks during winter break. Congratulation Carmel High and Caroline for living WE in your community!



A Round of Applause for Antioch Charter Academy II! For their first trimester Social Political Action project, students at Antioch Charter focused on the issue s of local hunger and homelessness. They held a canned food drive for Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano counties and collected an amazing 623 items of food total! The students also learned more about

the issue by arranging for the school to host a play with professional actors put on by the Food Bank called the "Hungry Play". One hundred students watched the show which was both entertaining and raised their awareness about hunger in the local community and how the food bank plays a role in helping to fight hunger. Further, students collected toiletries to put together 61 care kits for the homeless - and they did not stop there. Students volunteered time to serve breakfast to approximately 40 people at Café Sunrise, a local soup kitchen serving breakfast from First Baptist church in Pittsburg, California were they were also able to pass out the toiletry kits that they had put together. Finally, 10 students volunteered two hours each to help set up for a large homeless community event called *Project Connect* put on by the Contra Costa County Health Services, which helped over 500 adults and 100 children get medical care, information about local shelters, clothes and coats, and toiletry kits! What an amazing example of *Living WE at School* – and it is only one out of three social action projects these students will take. Wow!
