Calculate Your Eligibility Index

STEP 1: Calculate your CSU GPA

- 1. Login to AERIES and pull up your unofficial transcript
- 2. Locate the A-G courses (you'll see a "P" under the "CP / College Prep" column)
- 3. GOOGLE: CSU GPA Calculator and follow the online instructions for calculating your CSU GPA (the CSU's limit the number of Honors/AP grade bumps students can use while calculating their 10-11 weighted GPA. More info online).
