

# Blog Post #3: Feature Story

## Quarter 1

**Points Possible: 40**

**Category: Writing**

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In every novel, there are significant issues, events, developments, etc. that happen. A character may fall in love, fall out of love, save the day, or lose their job. A character may take a trip that changes their life, or make a decision that changes another character's life. All of these events are "newsworthy" moments in your novel.

**For today's post, write a feature story.** Discuss something important that is going on in this section of your novel. Use textual evidence from your novel to quote important moments from the event you choose to highlight in your feature story. Feel free to mix it up with your feature story, including images, media, or other sites or important people that may be relevant to this moment in your novel. For example, you might write "In a recent story from the New York Times (highlight that text and link the article) psychologist Dr. Jan Day wrote, 'blah blah blah'. You get the idea.

**How will you turn an event from your novel into headline news?** Write a feature story on your blog. Make clear references to the plot of your novel when writing your article. Support your article with at least **one piece of textual evidence** from this section of your novel. Be sure to include specific plot details from this week's reading to show your knowledge of the novel so far. **Include a clear and enticing title for your blog post.**

**Your feature story post must include:**

- A clear and enticing title for your post
- Specific details about this section of your novel to show your comprehension of the plot and characters
- A feature story highlighting an issue or event from Week #3's reading with **clear plot references** to support the story
- **One piece of textual evidence** from your Week #3 reading, properly cited with relevant analysis
