Poetic idea

"I will go on loving you until my persistence makes you love me." The singer is Aminta, a shepherd, who is puzzled by the unresponsive behavior of Silvia, a shepherdess, who used to love him.

Background

Like Antonio Lotti, Caldara was a choirboy at St. Mark's Basilica in Venice under the direction of Giovanni Legrenzi. In 1710 Caldara wrote *Faithfulness in Love Defeats Treachery* for the public theater at Macerata. He was the music director of a princely household in Rome, where the opera was repeated the next year. The moralistic title assured the audience no religious person would be offended by the story.

In 1716 Caldara moved to Austria to serve the Imperial Court in Vienna. There he composed new music to the libretto of this opera. Entitled *Opera Pastorale*, it includes an aria, "Sebben crudele," but with a different melody.

The essential parts of this aria consist of 30 measures of vocal music, which are repeated in various ways, by the voice and by the instruments, to form a full-length aria. With all of its repetitions, the original is 160 measures long. This edition omits some repetitions, shortening the aria

The familiar version was edited by Parisotti in *Arie Antiche*, Vol. 1 (Milan: Ricordi, 1885). He used an eighth-note pulse throughout, lessening the minuet character of the aria.
